SOCIAL JUSTICE CORNER

A letter from Miami Valley Immigration Coalition...

We just received a request to assist with an unconscionably high immigration bond of \$35,000! This is for a woman we will call "Melinda" who has been a U.S. resident for more than fifteen years. She is the sole provider for her teenage son and his father who has a serious medical condition. She was taken by immigration near her work place and is now in detention at Butler County Jail. Like half of the people taken into immigration detention during the current administration, she has no criminal history and is only "guilty" of the civil offense of being in the country without authorization. The request is urgent; it is estimated that without bond payment she is likely to be deported. If she is released on bond then a different "calendar" goes into effect, and she and her attorney will have time to gather the information to make her case to remain in the country, and continue contributing to her family and community. In some ways, she is "fortunate," in that a bond has been set; many are being held with no option to pay bond and be released.

The attorney asked the judge to repeat the bond amount because he thought he misheard as \$3,500 seemed correct, for someone with long community ties, supporting her family, and no criminal record. It is unlikely that we alone can raise \$35,000 but the hope is to reach \$35,000 when combined with funds from other sources: her extended family and friends are putting together what they can and we are seeking to partner with another bond fund elsewhere.

Disclaimer: Almost all of the bond funds we have raised have gone to pay immigration bond. However, we have used, and may in the future use, some funds for related relief, such as transportation, legal fees, and commissary fees (for phone, hygiene, and food in immigration detention). Since 2022, we have assisted five people: with three bonds (\$8,000, \$3,000, \$7,000), and \$1,040 for transportation for two people released on bond (from Arizona and Texas to Dayton). As expected, bonds are higher under the current administration. We did recently partner with others for "Gabrio's" January bond of \$10,000: we paid \$7,000 from our bond fund and immigration activists in California paid \$3,000. However, with the exorbitant and unjustifiable bond of \$35,000, if our efforts combined with "Melinda's" family and another bond fund, still do not succeed, then funds raised will be saved for a future bond and/or for related relief.

Our collective action is so important as we combat the harm our broken immigration system inflicts on so many, especially in this time of heightened fear-mongering and scapegoating and the repeated and blatant lack of due process for our immigrant neighbors.
